SUMMARY

This year's Better Buildings By Design Conference was a hit. The exhibit hall was full and informative, the workshops were educational and entertaining, and the heavy snow didn't seem to keep many people away.

No one could attend every workshop, so everyone would have a unique perspective, but I know I learned a lot in the sessions I was able to attend. And even better, Efficiency Vermont said that they would be producing a CD with all of the workshop presentation material on it, for eventual distribution to all attendees. They'd hoped to have that ready by April, so I'm watching for it.

The keynote was by Bert Gregory of Mithun architects/planners in Seattle, and he showed a number of their projects and how they worked, in terms of LEED certification and with a "cradle-to-cradle" philosophy.

Workshops were themed on the building envelope, mechanical systems, lighting, and high-performance/innovation. The lighting workshops were interesting, including one about the physiological effects of various types and colors of light. I also got a workshop on the residential energy code, covering the new whole-house ventilation requirements; a kitchen lighting demonstration; a LEED overview with the latest developments in that program; an advanced wood-framing and design workshop; and two case studies in the "Vermont Builds Greener" home certification program (a Vermont LEED-like program for homes, which LEED doesn't really cover yet), showing two exceptionally innovative homes that achieved VGB-status.

Hopefully you got a chance to stop by the Vermont CSI booth to see us.

TechNotes

What does TechCom do?, part 2

In part 1 we looked at the first of the Institute Technical Committee's charges, oversight and coordination of technical task teams and liaison activities. Other charges are related to ongoing committee work, but a few are directly related to creation of new documents, or starting work on updating existing documents.

2004 saw major updates of CSI's flagship documents, MasterFormat and the Manual of Practice. That might seem like enough to handle for a while, but more changes are in the works. TechCom is required to periodically review all CSI technical documents, and PageFormat and SectionFormat are due. Because these two documents are so closely related, TechCom recommended that they be updated by a single task team. That recommendation was accepted, and by the time you read this, selection of members for the combined SectionFormat/PageFormat Task Team will be underway.

The sequence and timing make good sense, as the additional activities now addressed by MasterFormat suggest the need for additional subjects in SectionFormat. For example, sections that specify maintenance might require article or paragraph titles that are not in the current SectionFormat. PageFormat received a minor update just a few years ago, but there is good reason to look at it again. Because of the growing use of the Internet, documents are often produced to be viewed on screen rather than on paper, and the current PageFormat does not address such use.

Another technical document that is in the works is "Coordinating Drawings and Specifications." Although both the Project Resource Manual and the National CAD Standard make some mention of it, we have no document devoted to this important issue.

Feb. Board Meeting Summary

This is but a summary; the full text of the February 8, 2004 meeting minutes is available from the Chapter Secretary.

- Chapter stood at 126 members, 120 home chapter.
- Retention rate up to 49.2% for the chapter. For professional-level members (sans students) rate is estimated to be 84.2%. National average is approx. 80%.
- In a bit of region news, Jonathan Miller informed the board that he is stepping down as Region Secretary, but now looks to be the chair of the NE Region Membership Committee, as well as a member of the Institute's Membership Committee (i.e. national level).
- One member took advantage of the chapter's offer to partially sponsor CSI Show attendance in exchange for becoming active on the chapter board or in a committee. John Ostrum will be joining Jonathan Miller and Victoria Rickert in representing the VT Chapter at the convention.
- The board decided not to pursue a directors/officers insurance policy due to cost.
- Planning is underway for the May Trade Fair & LEED Workshop. Help with getting tabletops is needed – contact John Gant or Jonathan Miller if you can assist (see contact info at left).
- Jonathan Miller will not continue as Programs Chair for FY06. He has volunteered to run two programs for the year but will only be able to assist with the rest. The chapter will likely need more than one volunteer to pick up the slack. *[One of our newest chapter members, John Kamencik, CSI is one volunteer – he is a long-time listener first-time caller. Thank you John!]*
- The January chapter program on Construction Administration, with Sandy Fead and an illustrious discussion panel, was cut short by time and all volunteered to come back for a follow-up program. *[Scheduling has been difficult, and this program may have a rather different incarnation. See article on p.1.]*
- **Next Board Meeting:** April 7 2005, immediately following the chapter's annual meeting (location TBD – e-mail announcement forthcoming).

Walter Damuck, FCSI, AIA

On February 12, 2005 during a WEBEX teleconference of the Board of Directors, the Board approved the Honorary Membership nomination of Walter E. Damuck, FCSI, AIA.

Walter, a retired forensic architect has been a continuous member of CSI since 1959. He is a member of the Housatonic Chapter within the Northeast Region. Throughout his involvement Walt has touched and inspired many. Serving as a role model for young professionals and always willing to share his knowledge and experience has left lasting impressions on all those who are blessed to know him.

Graduating from Drexel Institute of Technology in 1939 with a BS in Civil Engineering launched Walter's eagerness to learn more about the industry he loves: Construction. He started as a timekeeper out of school on a large housing project. In March of 1942 he enlisted in the Corps of Engineers, was commissioned and assigned to an amphibious brigade. He served in North Africa, Sicily across Europe until he returned home in Nov. 1944.

Following his military career his quest for knowledge led him to Yale, where he began to read books from their School of Architecture motivating him to become a registered architect in 1964.

New Guide for Technical Documents Task Teams

TechCom is near completion of a new internal document, one that would be used by task teams, editorial advisory boards, and authors working on technical documents. It establishes standards for scheduling, tracking and responding to comments, and communication with TechCom and CSI staff.

One interesting requirement is that the group working on a technical document will also be responsible for creating an application guide to explain how to use the technical document. During development of MasterFormat 2004 and its application guide, it became apparent that there was a need for a set of defined terms to use when discussing how a technical document is to be used. For example, one writer might use "should" to indicate a mandatory requirement, while another would use the same word to indicate something that was preferred but not required. The new guide will include defined terms that will make it easier for the user to understand how to use a technical document.
