SUMMARY

Carl Childs walked us through a detailed analysis of seismic provisions, which the newly adopted IBC code uses. Part of a standard project code review should be determination of the seismic zone of the site. Some have reported that poor soils in this area can even put a project in the same Seismic Design Category as parts of California.

Bob Patterson looked at some of the more significant changes adopted in the 2005 VT Fire Code, and covered the ways that permit applications can be made more complete for a quicker and easier review process.

Two students also presented on their HVAC design project, which involved designing an efficient system for an existing residential tower in Dallas TX. Thanks very much to our speakers and to the students who presented their work !

Speaking Of Construction...

Arabella Holzapfel, CSI, is developing a podcast, *Speaking of Construction*, which she expects to debut in early May 2006. A typical episode will feature a conversation with an owner, designer, builder, or supplier from New England and will include segments covering industry news items and events in the region. The aim is to explore industry trends, learn about new materials, products, tools and practices, and have a good time doing it.

At least one special episode of *Speaking of Construction* will focus on the "graying" of the labor force -- the average age of skilled tradespeople in Vermont is 52-55. *Speaking of Construction* will talk to high school students, tradespeople (who look 'average age'), a representative of the Association of General Contractors, and others so we can view this situation from multiple perspectives.

Arabella also hopes to have a series of episodes that visit a building project every three months -- from pre-schematic design through completion of construction. Over the course of the building project, *Speaking of Construction* will chat with the owner's project team, the architecture team, consulting engineers, contractors, subcontractors, tradespeople, building occupants, and even specifiers!

'Legal Roundtable: Issues Affecting Design & Construction' Webinar scheduled for March 23

This presentation looks at key issues affecting CSI members including jobsite safety, liability to contractors and subcontractors, the standard of care, responsibility for mold, the role of the construction manager, "transparency" in contracting, and the risks associated with "value engineering." The presentation reviews recent decisions from courts across the country that have addressed these issues. If CSI members are informed of the latest developments in these areas of concern, they are better prepared to negotiate and administer their contracts, and manage the risks associated.

Specifications are contract provisions. Like any other portion of a construction contract which is unclear or unambiguous, a faulty specification often creates disputes which then must be resolved by the courts according to the basic rules of contract interpretation. Being familiar with these rules will not only help in understanding and using specifications, but it will enable specifiers to do a better job of crafting clear, concise specifications and avoiding disputes.

February Board Meeting Summary

This is but a summary; the full text of the 2/7/05 meeting minutes is available from the Chapter Secretary.

- The Vermont Chapter CSI was at +17 members for 2005. This figure had a small chance of qualifying for the Institute's "Chapter Cup" award.
- John Ostrum was working on a "Save The Date" postcard for distribution to CSI, VGBN, and beyond. A CSI contact name was needed for future detailed announcements. *[e-mail announcement has since been distributed]*
- The Financial Committee must be expanded by at least one additional member, such member to be qualified and willing to assume the position of Treasurer as of 1 July 2006. Current Treasurer Bob Rand will of course familiarize the new Treasurer with current Chapter practices, including accounting and tax filings.
- Treasurer Bob Rand wondered about funding available from the NE Region CSI for the CSI Show. The letter he recalls from NERCSI refers to the Region Conference, but not directly to the CSI Show. Jonathan noted that we should clarify with the Region Treasurer, asking if there are region funds available to member chapters for attendance of CSI University (which is in the same location as The CSI Show).
- The Institute Board of Directors was examining the status of the Institute's current CEO Karl Borgstrom. *[Borgstrom has since stepped down to pursue other endeavors.]*
- Victoria noted that the chapter's program announcements do not currently include a disclaimer about speakers' opinions not necessarily being those of the chapter, etc. *[Since been added]*
- John Ostrum and Jonathan Miller look to be Vermont CSI's Delegates to the 2006 Convention and CSI Show.

Recently, CSI staff issued a statement regarding a CDT renewal requirement. Please be aware that a CDT renewal requirement has not formally been adopted or implemented but is currently under consideration by CSI leadership. The intent of a renewal requirement is to keep construction professionals current with changes in the industry.

If such a policy is adopted and implemented, those who earned their CDT before the implementation date, would not be required to renew their CDT. Those who earn the CDT following implementation of a renewal policy would be required to renew their CDT once every three years. CSI encourages all CDT holders to pursue continuing education to ensure the highest standards.

Building Information Models At The CSI Show & Convention

CSI will offer several sessions on the topic of Building Information Models (BIMs) during The 50th Annual CSI Show & Convention in Las Vegas, March 28-April 1, including "BIM for Construction Planning," led by Kathleen Liston, Construction Solutions Product Manager for the Building Solutions Division at Autodesk.

BIMs are computerized 3D and 2D models linked to databases that house the specifications, schedules, and other documents related to a project. They give designers a faster, richer design process, owners more budget control through predictions about the project's construction process, and contractors projects with fewer surprises. BIMs can generate schedules, coordinate documents, and automatically update drawings as new data is added. They are a natural step for anyone dedicated to construction documents that meet the "4 Cs" of CSI—clear, concise, complete and correct.

Liston will share examples of how construction organizations are leveraging Building Information Models (BIMs) to support coordination, take-off and estimating, planning, managing, and execution. Case studies will be presented highlighting the benefits of using BIM to support these processes. The discussion will include how construction organizations can get started on the road to BIM, overcome implementation challenges, and successfully invest and benefit from BIM to better communicate, manage cost and schedule risk, and generate more revenue.

CSI is focusing on BIMs in the Show & Convention education program because BIMs are a solution more and more owners, designers, contractors and specifiers will be turning to in the future.

Architect Frank Gehry, FAIA, and his colleague Dennis R. Shelden, founder and Chief Technology Officer of Gehry Technologies, will kick off the Show & Convention with a discussion of how they use BIMs during the opening general session of The 50th Annual CSI Show & Convention.
